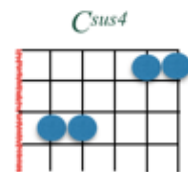
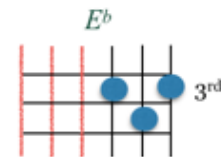
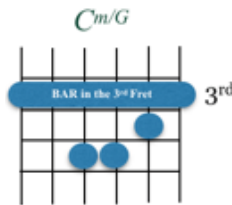


# Savior of the Nations, Come

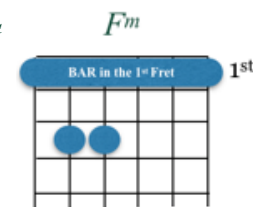

Woman's offspring, pure and fresh.

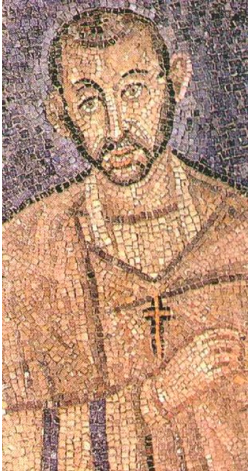

Aurelius Ambrosias (c. 340 – 397) wrote the lyrics for “**Savior of the Nations, Come**”. He was the Roman governor of Liguria and Emilia, headquartered in Milan. Better known in English as Ambrose, he became a bishop of Milan at the death of the former bishop Auxentius, who was a member of the Arian party promoting the non-trinitarian view of God.

The church in which the election for bishop was held was so filled with excited people that Ambrose found it necessary to take steps to preserve the peace, exhorting the crowd to peace and order. A voice suddenly exclaimed, "Ambrose is Bishop," and the cry was taken up on all sides. He was compelled to accept the post, though still only a catechumen; and was forthwith baptized, and within a week consecrated Bishop, Dec. 7, 374. He became one of the most influential ecclesiastical figures of the 4th century. Ambrose was a staunch opponent of Arianism.

Ambrose was one of the four original Doctors of the Church, and is notable for his influence on Augustine of Hippo.

Traditionally, Ambrose is credited with promoting "antiphonal chant", a style of chanting in which one side of the choir responds alternately to the other. In addition to others, he composed the Advent hymn, “**Veni redemptor gentium**”. The hymn was particularly popular in Germany where Martin Luther translated it into German as “**Nun komm, der Heiden Heiland**”, “**Savior of the Nations, Come**”. Johann Gottfried Walther or Luther created the chorale, based on the original plainchant.
